




DEMOGRAPHICS

As of 2021, the population of Portage la Prairie sits at 20,158 individuals, across a land area of 1,998.17 square kilometers. The region has experienced a population growth of approximately 3.3% percent over the last decade, increasing from 19,521 in 2011. According to Manitoba Health, Healthy Living and Seniors, the population is forecasted to grow by 34.54% between 2021 to 2046.




The average and median age in the region of Portage la Prairie is slightly lower than the national average of Canada but slightly higher compared to Manitoba.



WORKFORCE

Portage la Prairie offers an educated workforce, with over half the population having received post-secondary education. 

The leading occupations in Portage la Prairie are in sales and services (23.8%), followed by Trades, Transport and Equipment Operators and related occupations (19.33%), Education, Law and Social, Community and Government Services (15%), and Business, Finance and Administration occupations (12.73%)

In addition, 6.55% are employed in Natural Resources, Agriculture and related production occupations and 6.18% in Manufacturing and Utilities.




Knowledge of official languages

Almost all residents of Portage la Prairie are able to communicate in English (93.94%), while 5.44% of the population is bilingual, with knowledge of both English and French.

Mother Tongue

English is the mother tongue for the majority of the region, comprising of approximately 80% of the population, followed by Indo-European languages (12.45%) and French (1.65%).







IMMIGRATION



Immigration Status and Period of Immigration

Of the total population in private households in Portage la Prairie, approximately 8% (1,455) are immigrants. The rate of immigration is, however, growing rapidly, with the last decade (2011 to 2021) seeing more immigrants than the previous four decades combined. Within the last decade, the period between 2011 and 2015 saw 270 new immigrants, whereas the period between 2016 and 2021 saw 545 new immigrants, over twice as many.






INDUSTRY AND EMPLOYMENT

Roquette has recently opened a 200,000-squarefoot facility in Portage la Prairie, the largest of its kind in the world, to meet the growing global demand for pea protein. Billed as "the plant of the future," it is equipped to produce pea protein for food and sports nutrition products, along with food-grade starches and components like pea cream for animal feed.


Mandatory Benefits

Vacations: Employees must receive at least 2 weeks of vacation per year for the first four years of employment, and a minimum of 3 weeks of vacation after the fifth consecutive year. For each week of vacation, employees are entitled to 2% of the wages earned in that year, meaning that, employers may put vacation pay on every cheque, or they may choose to pay out at the time of the vacation leave.

General holidays: They are days recognized by law as holidays. Employees either have this day off with pay or are paid differently if they work. Holidays include: New Year's Day, Louis Riel Day, Good Friday, Victoria Day, July 1st, Labour Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.

Overtime: Overtime is due 1.5 times the hourly wage.

Minimum Wage: The minimum wage in Manitoba province as in Portage la Prairie is \$13.5/hr.






INDUSTRIAL

Construction costs in Manitoba and surrounding areas (e.g. Portage la Prairie) are much lower for building industrial facilities than in other major Canadian cities. Costs are 23% lower than in Vancouver, 29% lower than in Toronto, and 13% lower than in Montreal.


COMMERCIAL (OFFICE)

In the case of commercial facilities (office spaces) the construction costs in Manitoba are 18% lower than in Vancouver, 28% lower than in Toronto, and 10% lower than in Montreal (for specific cases).


01 PROPERTY TAX

Property taxes in Manitoba are calculated by applying the municipal and educational mill rates (municipal tax rate) against the portioned assessments of a property, which is 45% for residential buildings.

02 INCOME TAX


Income taxes in Manitoba are calculated similarly to the rest of Canada, using the federal tax brackets and rates, but with a provincial tax component added on top. Provincial tax rates in Manitoba are lower than the federal tax rates, but still contribute significantly to the overall tax bill.



03 CORPORATE TAX

The corporate provincial income tax rate for Manitoba, which applies to Portage la Prairie, is 12% which is in line with the national average. For small businesses, corporate provincial income tax is 0% on the first \$500,000 CAD of active business income.

COMPREHENSIVE PROGRAMS AND INCENTIVES, TO TAKE YOUR BUSINESS TO THE NEXT LEVEL



Business Expansion/Capital Investment

Industry Expansion Program

The Industry Expansion Program is aimed at supporting companies that are locating new operations in Manitoba or expanding existing Manitoba operations.

Manitoba Works Capital Incentive

The Manitoba Works Capital Incentive encourages significant new business investment or existing business expansion by creating a competitive tax environment to help diversify Manitoba's economy and stimulate job creation.



New Product/Process Development

Innovation Growth Program

The IGP provides cost-sharing assistance to Small and Medium-Sized Enterprises (SMEs) to assist them in developing and commercializing new innovative products and processes. Under the IGP, firms may apply for a non-repayable grant of up to \$100,000 per project to cost-share eligible expenses on a 50/50 basis. The IGP approves projects using a competitive process and quarterly intakes.



Green Energy

Green Energy Equipment Tax Credit

"Property owners who install a geothermal heat pump system in Manitoba can receive tax credits from the Manitoba government as follows:

a 7.5% tax credit – on geothermal heat pumps that are manufactured in Manitoba for use in Manitoba, plus a 15% tax credit – on the remainder of the capital costs of the geothermal system (excluding the heat pump) if the installer is certified by the Manitoba Geothermal Energy Alliance, Inc."

PROGRAMS AND INCENTIVES



Workforce Training/Development

Small Business Minimum Wage Adjustment Program

The Small Business Minimum Wage Adjustment Program provides support to small businesses to help offset the impact of the minimum wage increase on October 1, 2022 from \$11.95/hr to \$13.50/hr.

Canada-Manitoba Job Grant

The Canada-Manitoba Job Grant is an employer-driven approach to help Manitobans gain the skills they need to fill available jobs and to help employers develop the skills of their existing workers to meet the requirements of their present job, or to move into a better job.

Sector Council Program

The Sector Council Program supports organizations in key Manitoba sectors to develop and deliver workforce training for new and existing employees to support business growth and prosperity.

Workforce Development Program

The Workforce Development Program assists companies to assess human resource (HR) management needs and develop and implement HR and workforce training and development plans.

Paid Work Experience Tax Credits

The Paid Work Experience family of tax credits provides qualified employers with a percentage of the wages and salaries paid to certain types of trainee employees and recent graduates working in Manitoba.

Young Entrepreneurs Grant Program

The Young Entrepreneurs Program encourages Manitoba's young people to start their own full-time, viable businesses, and in the process pursue self-employment as a career choice. Under the Young Entrepreneurs program, approved applicants are eligible for a grant of up to \$4,000 to help defray business start-up costs and capital expenditures.

First Jobs Fund

The First Jobs Fund Program is designed to support innovative employment and training experiences to prepare at-risk youth aged 15-29 for their first job, which increases likelihood of future sustainable employment.



Equity Capital

Community Enterprise Development Tax Credit

The Community Enterprise Development Tax Credit (CEDTC) provides a refundable Manitoba tax credit of up to 45% to individuals and corporations who acquire equity capital in community-based enterprises in Manitoba.

Small Business Venture Capital Tax Credit Program

The Small Business Venture Capital Tax Credit (SBVCTC) provides a non-refundable Manitoba tax credit of up to 45% to individuals and corporations who acquire equity capital in eligible Manitoba enterprises.

Employee Share Purchase Tax Credit

The Employee Share Purchase Tax Credit offers employees (including directors and officers of an eligible corporation) the opportunity to buy into and own a portion of a business under an Employee Share Ownership Plan (ESOP). The aim of the program is to support business growth, facilitate succession planning for family businesses and promote employee participation in business success.

The Manufacturing Investment Tax Credit supports businesses by providing an eight per cent tax credit (seven per cent refundable and a one per cent non-refundable) that acquire qualified plant, machinery and equipment for first-time use in manufacturing or processing in Manitoba.

The Métis (1,825) and the First Nations (1,820) are the two most significant indigenous population groups. In Portage la Prairie, the three major First Nations that make up the Dakota Ojibway Tribal Council are the Dakota Tipi, Dakota Plain, and Long Plain.



PARKS AND RECREATION



The two aquatic parks, Splashland and Stride place provide water activities all year round. Splashland opens at the arrival of summer, offering a fun and accessible aquatic experience for all ages. Stride place is inside the Shindleman Aquatic Centre and is home to Manitoba's largest indoor wave pool, depth beach entry, hot tub, lazy river, and a large indoor waterslide.

In addition, Stride place's facilities include two NHL regulation-size arenas, a 4,000-square-foot fitness center, and other special event facilities that can host a variety of conferences, trade shows, and receptions.


PORTAGE EXHIBITION GROUNDS

Located on Island Park, the Portage industrial exhibition association celebrates the region's agricultural heritage since 1872. Every summer, the portage fair is hosted, and the exhibition grounds host events like horse shows, pumpkin contests, or concerts. The site also provides a campground with 44 electric/water sites, washrooms, and showers. In addition to the two outdoor arenas, the Portage exhibition grounds is home to the MNP Exhibition Building, which accommodates up to 600 people, making it the perfect place for an outdoor wedding or special event.

PORTAGE GOLF CLUB




PORTAGE CURLING CLUB


Enjoying nature and spectacular views while walking is possible at the Crescent Walking Path. The 5,2km pathway surrounding Island Park is paved, illuminated, and accessible 24/7. Crescent lake is also the habitat for geese, ducks, and pelicans among others, offering an up-close proximity to view the entire flock, which can be seen from the Crescent walking path and other lakeside vantage points.



OUTDOOR PARADISE

Just 25km north of Portage la Prairie is located one of Canada's largest lakes: Lake Manitoba. Lake Manitoba is the largest natural lake in Western Canada, and it's also home to the world's largest inland delta. The lake itself is home to a wide variety of fish, including walleye and northern pike, as well as a number of birds and other animals.

The average commute time is 15 to 30 minutes by car.

In Portage la Prairie transport is mostly by passenger vehicle: the city counts around 7 local taxi and shuttle services. The city is also served by the Mahihkan Bus Lines to Flin Flon and Winnipeg, and a train service (Via Rail) with destinations across the country to the Portage la Prairie Train Station. Two companies for seniors and the disabled, offer transportation services in and out of town.



The average rent is \$975

The average rent is \$975, ranging from \$552 for a studio to \$1,199 for a 3+ bedroom. In Portage La prairie, the vacancy rate is 8.7% for a 1-bedroom apartment, 9.9% for 2 bedrooms, and 11.8% for a 3+ bedrooms.



50 to 90 construction permits are delivered every year

Portage la Prairie is developing an expansion of the city with a new residential area located to the east of 9th Street SE and south of Saskatchewan Avenue. The area has approximately 45.6 acres parcel of land, of which approximately 36.8 acres are developable after removing utility easements. The new area will include sidewalks, active transportation, and all the utilities.

The average length of construction for housing is 5.9 months, and between 50 and 90 construction permits are delivered each year in the city and between 70 and 100 for the rural area.

Healthwise, Portage la Prairie is served by the Portage District General Hospital, regulated by the Southern Health-Santé Sud regional health authority. With around 90 beds, and 20 specialties such as cancer care, obstetrics, dialysis, laboratory, and surgery, this hospital can help all members of the family. This hospital also provides service in French.

7 General Practitioners, 2 General Surgeons and 2 ENT Surgeons

Established in 1992, the Portage Clinic is served by 31 physicians, including 27 general practitioners, two general surgeons, and two ENT surgeons. The clinic has a walk-in service, as well as pharmacy, dental, hearing, and physiotherapy services.

Primary general care services with or without an appointment.


The Portage walk-in clinics and the White Cross Health Care Portage allows getting primary general care services with or without an appointment.

A new \$283 million hospital will replace the current Portage District General Hospital. The new facility is expected to be completed in 2025 and will have at least 90 acute care inpatient beds, with increased day surgery capacity, an expanded emergency department and enhanced programs.
